Encaustics Workshop for Fiber and Textile Artists

Join California artist, Daniella Woolf, for two days of intensive instruction in the basics of mixing the worlds of encaustics and fibers. Students will receive instruction in safety, compatibility of fiber and wax, creating smooth and textured surfaces, transferring Xeroxes, collaging various materials, imbedding objects, working on paper, and dipped and poured surfaces. Students should bring mark making tools (dental tools, ceramic trimming tools, palette knives, pin tools, etc) and collage materials to imbed (Xerox prints, drawings, small pieces of handmade papers, small pieces of chicken wire or hardware cloth, thread, small metal objects).

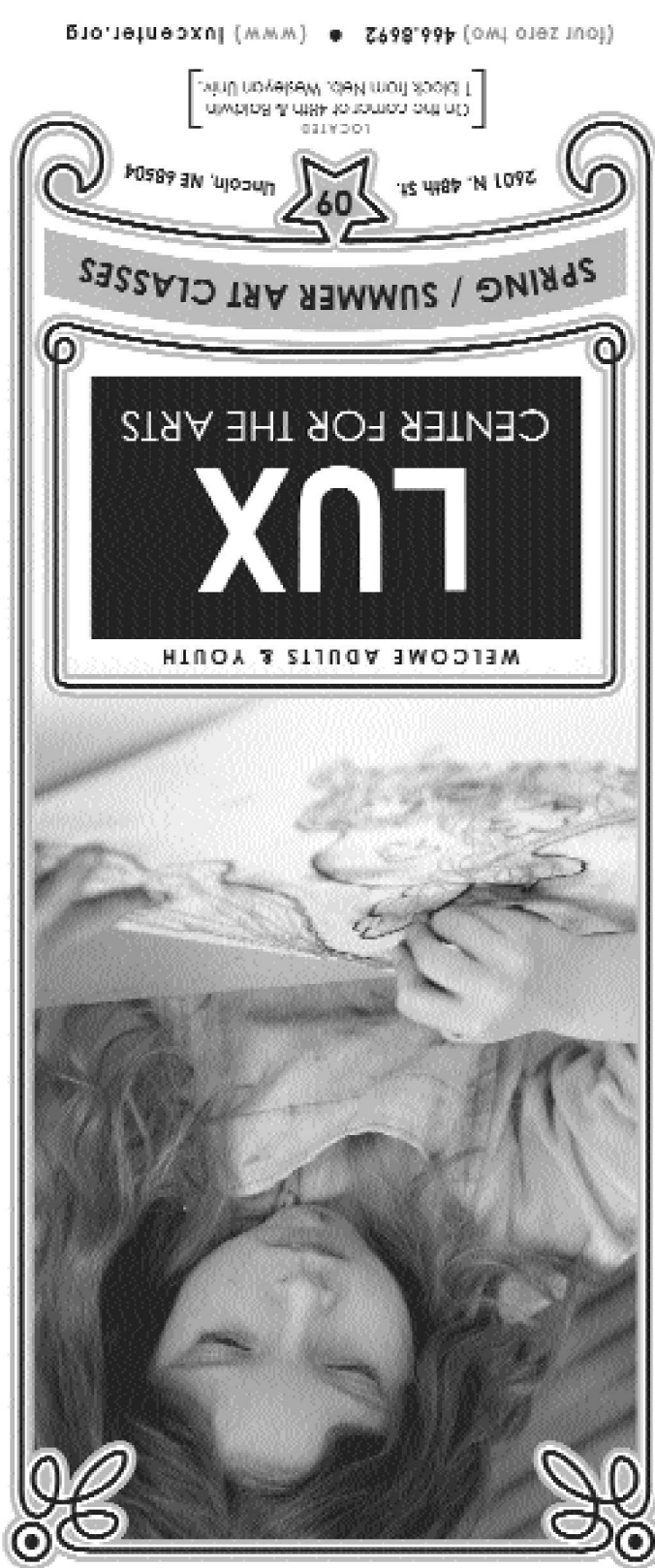
